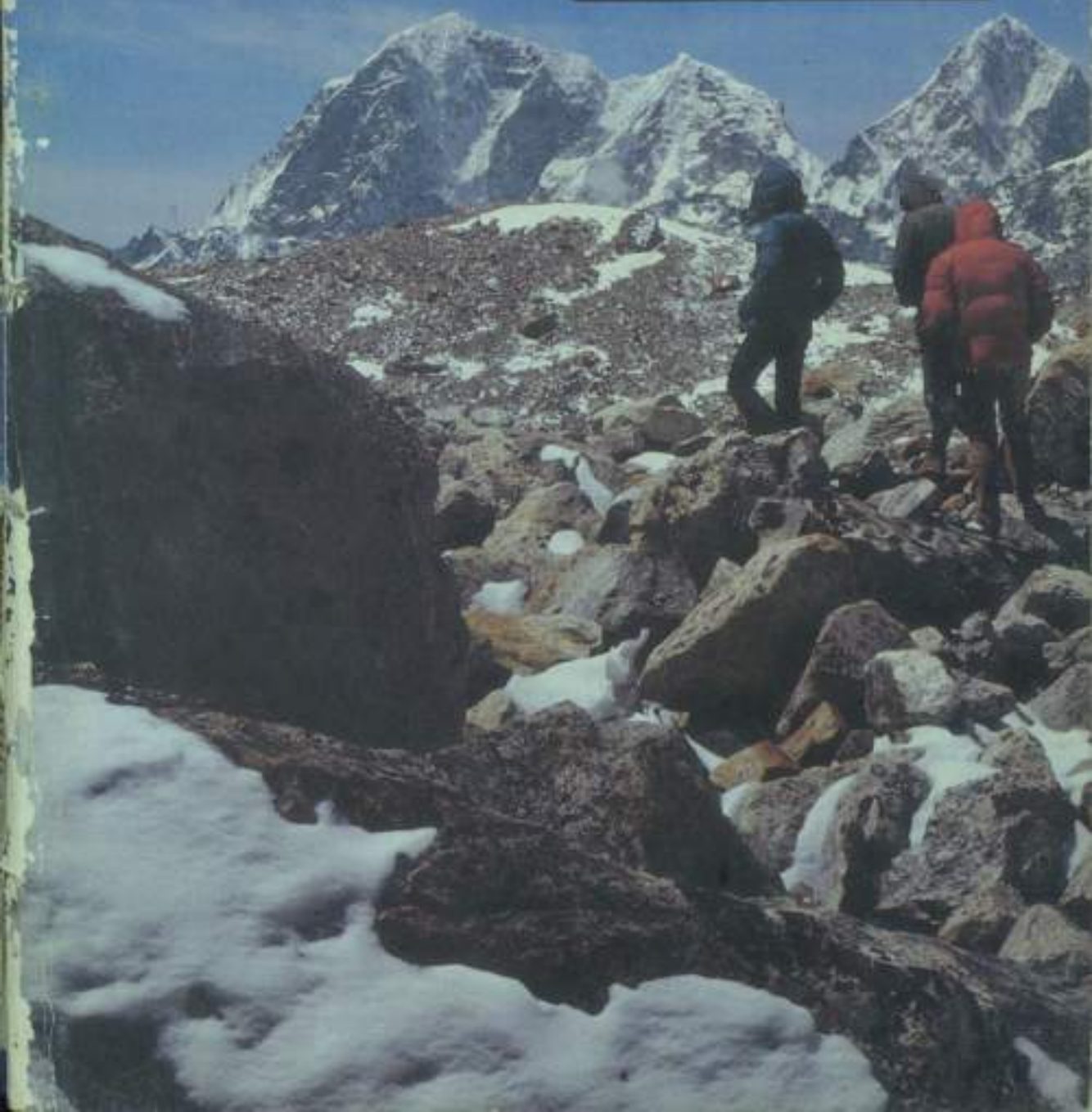

PART I

Introduction & Highlights of Tourism Related Activities

A. Introduction

As per the UN Guidelines for Tourism Statistics 1971, the visitors are classified into two categories. 'Excursionist'- staying for less than 24 hours and, 'Tourist'- staying for over 24 hours or at least one night. For the preparation of this 'Statistical Report' Indian tourists coming by air and other tourists from third country coming by both air and surface traffics have been taken into consideration.

This report contains statistics relating to the tourists in terms of their nationality, country of residence, mode of transport, purpose of visit, age, sex and other relevant matters. It also includes the tourism receipt and availability of services in Nepal. The latter part of the report gives the information regarding Nepalese nationals visiting abroad.

B. Highlights of the year

The tourism sector of Nepal demonstrated considerable degree of resilience during 1989. It underwent some hardships due to expiry of trade and transit treaties with India in March 1989 and a subsequent stalemate for the following 15 months. However, as an active sector of national economy, tourism continued to perform briskly during the entire year. Several activities were organised to ensure growth and promotion of tourism.

With the cooperation of Pacific Asia Travel Association (PATA), the first ever Adventure Travel Conference and Mart in the world was held in Kathmandu from January 23 to 25. The conference was participated by 129 delegates and the mart by 26 sellers and 68 buyers respectively.

Immediately after the Adventure Travel Conference & Mart, a joint meeting of PATA South Asia chapters was also held in Kathmandu on January 26 and 27.

The Secretary in the Ministry of Tourism led a delegation to the convention of American Society of Travel Agents (ASTA) held in New Delhi in April. The post convention tour of ASTA Governors' Council members was also organised in Kathmandu from April 7 to 10.

A delegation led by the Joint-Secretary in the Ministry of Tourism comprising the Government Royal Nepal Airlines Corporation (RNAC) and private sector personnels visited New Delhi from April 12 to 14 to reassure the Nepal-sellers in India of the minimum impact of the Nepal-India Trade & Transits impasse on Nepalese tourism. Likewise, on May 22, Hotel Association of Nepal (HAN) also organised one of its executive meetings in New Delhi.

In order to counter media disinformation about Nepalese tourism engendered by trade disputes with India, the Minister of tourism visited Singapore at the head of the Nepalese delegation to 38th Annual Conference of PATA organised between April 16 to 20. During the event the minister organized a separate press briefing for international media and visiting delegates to disseminate factual information on contemporary tourism situation of Nepal. The minister also led a Nepalese delegation to the eighth General Assembly of World Tourism organisation (WTO) held in Paris from August 26 to September 1. Following participation at WTO General Assembly, the high level delegation comprising the Minister, Secretary, Director General of the Department of Tourism, Managing Director of the Royal Nepal Airlines Corporation (RNAC), representatives from Hotel Association of Nepal (HAN), Nepal

Association of Travel Agents (NATA) and Trekking Agents Association of Nepal (TAAN) made promotional visits to some of the major European cities. Under this programme separate "Nepal evening" receptions were held in Paris, London and Frankfurt during the first half of September. Largely attended by prominent personalities in travel trade and well-wishers of Nepal, these receptions featured travel video show on Nepal, press briefings and discussions on Nepalese tourism.

In accordance with an agreement reached between His Majesty's Government and Asian Development Bank (ADB) on June 26, 1989, the bank provided Nepal an advisory technical assistance of US \$ 460,000 to conduct a feasibility study for long-term tourism development programme in Nepal. A British firm, T. & C. Ross Management Consultants was appointed to make the study and submit report by early part of 1990. In order to give guidelines and review the preliminary findings of the consultants, a 13-member steering committee was formed under the chairmanship of the Director General, Department of Tourism.

International air service to and from Nepal continued some expansion during 1989. The national flag carrier RNAC started its regular operation of flight to London from October 5, 1989. Druk Air started flights between Thimphu, Bhutan and Kathmandu from April 7.

As a result of impressive growth in tourist service and specialized adventure agencies, two more tourism-related associations came into existence during 1989. Tourist Guide Association of Nepal (TURGAN) was established in July and Nepal Association of Rafting Agents (NARA) came into being in December.

With a view to highlight the rich diversity of adventure products available in the Himalayan kingdom of Nepal, Department of Tourism produced a video film entitled "Nepal: The Land of Adventures" in 1989. This video film was screened at International Leipzig Documentary & Short Film Festival at Leipzig, East Germany in November. A 1988 PATA Gold Award winning travel video film entitled "Nepal: Where the Legend Lives" was screened on American television network four times during the year.

Under the joint auspices of World Tourism Organization (WTO) and United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), a tourism related "Financial Management course" was organized in Kathmandu from August 14 to September 1. The course was attended by 14 participants from 8 countries in South Asia.

This year also made some notable achievements in tourism-related studies & research. A comprehensive report on "Income and Employment Generation from Tourism in Nepal" was brought out by Nepal Rastra Bank, the national bank of Nepal. A study was made by Ministry of Tourism to assess the need of Indian tourists to Nepal. Some of the important heritage sites within the Kathmandu valley were studied with a view to render them touristically attractive.

A workshop on "Negotiating with Transnational Corporation" was organized in December under the joint auspices of Ministry of Industry and Ministry of Tourism in view of increasing foreign investment flow into tourism industries of Nepal.

A team of International Tourism Institute of Japan (ITDIJ) visited Nepal to find out possible areas of cooperation in tourism sector of Nepal.

Under His Majesty's Government's policy of diversifying new areas for adventure tourism on a phasewise basis, southern part of Dolpa district in west Nepal was opened for trekkers from June.

The tourist attractions of Nepal got coverage in various international travel magazines and newspapers in various parts of the world. Some of the print media having covered Nepal as a tourist destination during the year are Tourism Asia, TTR, Geo, Washington Post, Times of India, Navabharat Times, Wall Street Journal, Travel Scene Asia, Safari India, Vagabond and Thai Inflight magazine.

Some changes were made in visa regulations of Nepal in April with a view to enhance the growing tourist traffic into Nepal.

Under the annual publication programme, Department of Tourism published 2,95,000 copies of brochures and folders, 100,000 copies of posters, 150,000 pieces of stickers, 15,000 copies of kit holders and 1500 copies of hard cover books on Nepal's tourism.

Nepal took part in 12 international tourism and trade fairs held in various countries during different months of the year. Countries like England, USA, Japan, Germany, the Netherlands, Italy, Sweden, Switzerland, Finland, Hong Kong and Bangladesh were covered for this purpose. Emphasis was laid on joint participation, incorporating the government, RNAC and private sector in all promotion endeavours abroad. The 38th Annual Conference of PATA held in Singapore in the third week of April along with PATA World Chapters congress and PATA Board of Director's Meeting were participated by Nepal. Department of Tourism also joined hands with Trade Promotion Centre (TPC), among others, to take part in one-country "Nepal Exhibition" held in Dacca, Bangladesh from 21 to 25 December 1989.

Altogether 13 new trekking agencies and 14 travel agencies were issued licenses during 1989. Similarly, 20 hotels and two restaurants were granted permission for establishment under the Industrial Enterprises Act.

PART II

Summary of Tourism, 1989

Summary of Tourism, 1989

1. TOURIST ARRIVALS

A total to 239,945 tourists visited Nepal in 1989. This number is 9.8 percent lower than the annual total of 1988.

The decline in number of total arrivals is attributed to decrease in Indian arrivals. The expiry of trade and transit treaties between India and Nepal in March 1989 and the prolonged stalemate for the following 15 months somehow resulted in 39.9% decrease in Indian visitors compared to the previous year. During the period the non-Indian arrivals had actually shown an increase of 1.4% over 1988.

The average length of stay per visitor in Nepal is 12 days.

A. Arrivals by Region

Tourists from western Europe constitute the highest share of 43.6% among all the continents. The arrivals from Asia, North America and Australia & Pacific stand at 36.0%, 11.7% and 5.8% respectively.

If we compare the figures with previous year, Western Europe shows an increase of 5% and Australia and Pacific an increase of 2.8%, while in case of Asia, there is a shortfall of 24.3% over the preceding year, largely due to the decline in Indian arrivals. Similarly North America also showed a decrease of 7.6%.

B. Mode of Transport

Visitors entering by air constitute 86.6% of the total arrivals whereas those entering by land stand at 13.4%.

C. Arrivals by sex and Age

The male visitors comprise 60.9% as against 39.1% of female visitors in 1989.

By age group the highest share goes to the group of 16 to 30 years, comprising 32.6% of the total arrivals. It is closely followed by 31 to 45 age group, constituting 32.5% of the total.

D. Purpose of visit

Like in the past years, the predominant motivation for travel to Nepal continues to remain pleasure in 1989 also. Pleasure visitors account for 75.4% of the total arrivals.

E. Trekkers

There was a slight decline of 0.4% in the number of trekkers in 1989. Out of 60,858 trekkers, 43.2% were handled through registered trekking agencies. A total of 36,484 or 60% of the trekkers visited Annapurna area while Everest and Langtang treks were used by 19.4% and 14% respectively.

F. Mountaineers.

A total of 125 expedition teams were granted permission to climb different Himalayan peaks during 1989, out of which only 47 teams were successful in their attempts.

G. Visitors to Pokhara & Chitwan.

Pokhara was visited by over 65 thousand non-Indian visitors in 1989 which constitutes around one-third of the total non-Indian travellers coming to Nepal during the year. Similarly there were, 31,446 or 16.12% of the total non-Indian visitors in Chitwan valley during 1989.

2. REVENUE FROM TOURISM

Tourism contributes approximately 3.7% to the GDP of the nation. The total revenue generated from the sector in 1989 stands at US\$ 68,343,000 which shows an increase of 7.6% over the previous year, even though the total arrivals registered a setback. The per capita expenditure of the visitor per day in Nepal grew to the tune of US\$ 29 after standing at US\$ 27 continuously for four preceding years.

3. TOURISM SERVICES

The total number of tourist hotels in 1989 is 159, of which 86 are based in the Kathmandu valley and the rest in outstations like Pokhara and Chitwan. The total number of rooms available in these hotels is 4874 and the beds 9408. Kathmandu valley accounts for 3593 rooms with 6759 beds whereas the hotels outside the valley account for 1281 rooms with 2649 beds. Thus the year 1989 registered an increase of 32.5% in number of hotels, 23% in rooms and 17.4% in number of beds.

The numbers of travel and trekking agencies in 1989 stand at 104 and 101 respectively.

4. DEPARTURE OF NEPALESE NATIONALS

A total of 66,309 Nepalese nationals went abroad during 1989. This number is an increase of 6.6% over the previous year.

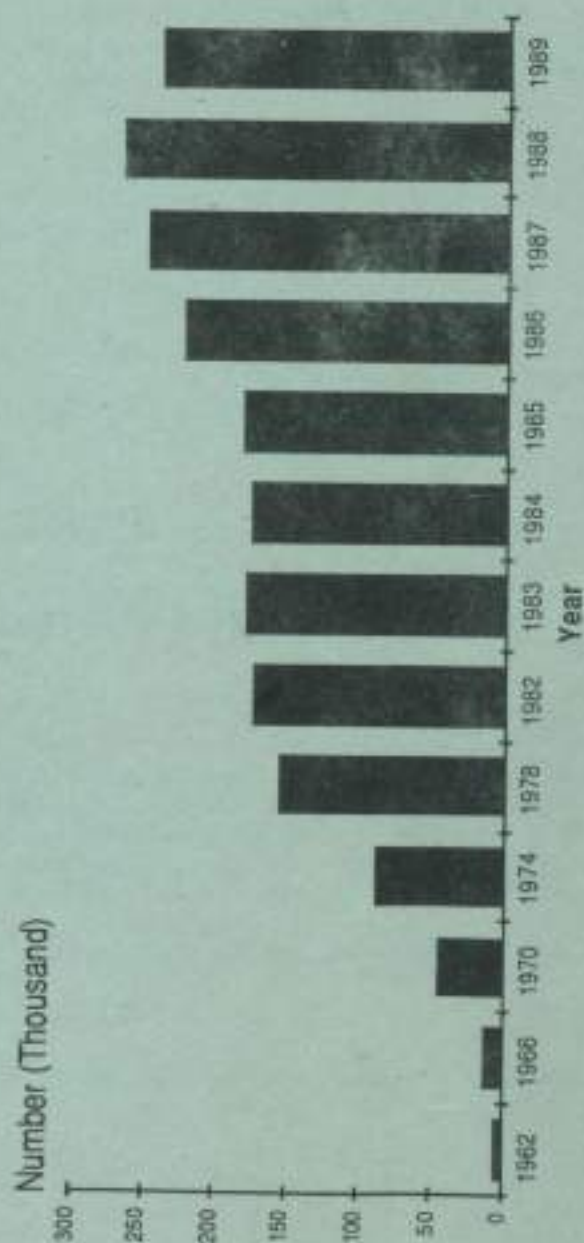

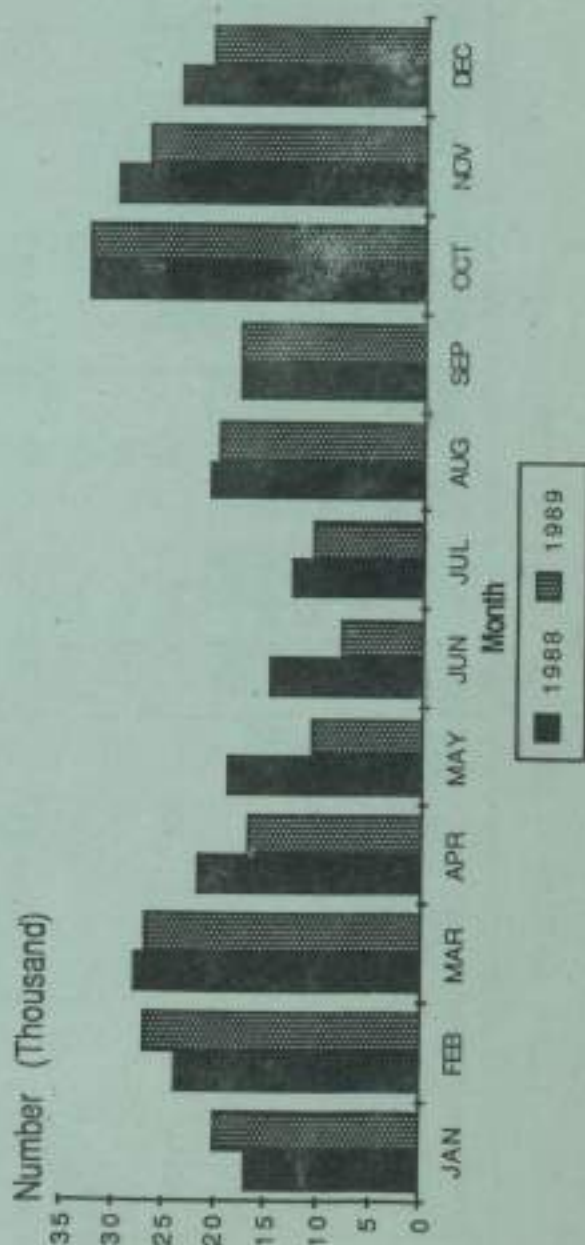

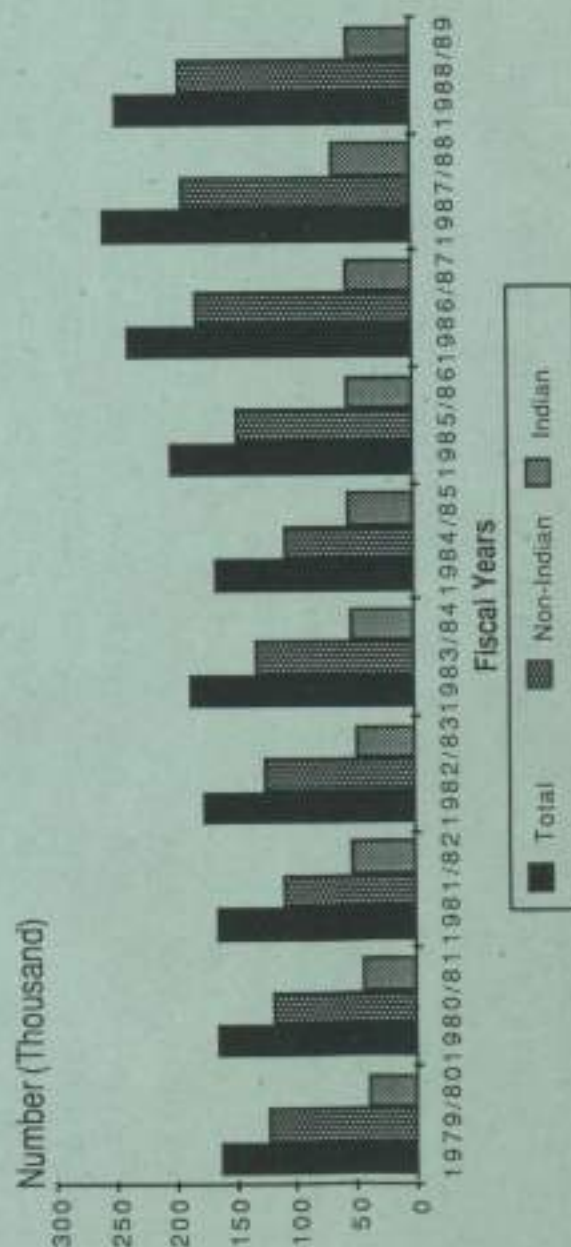

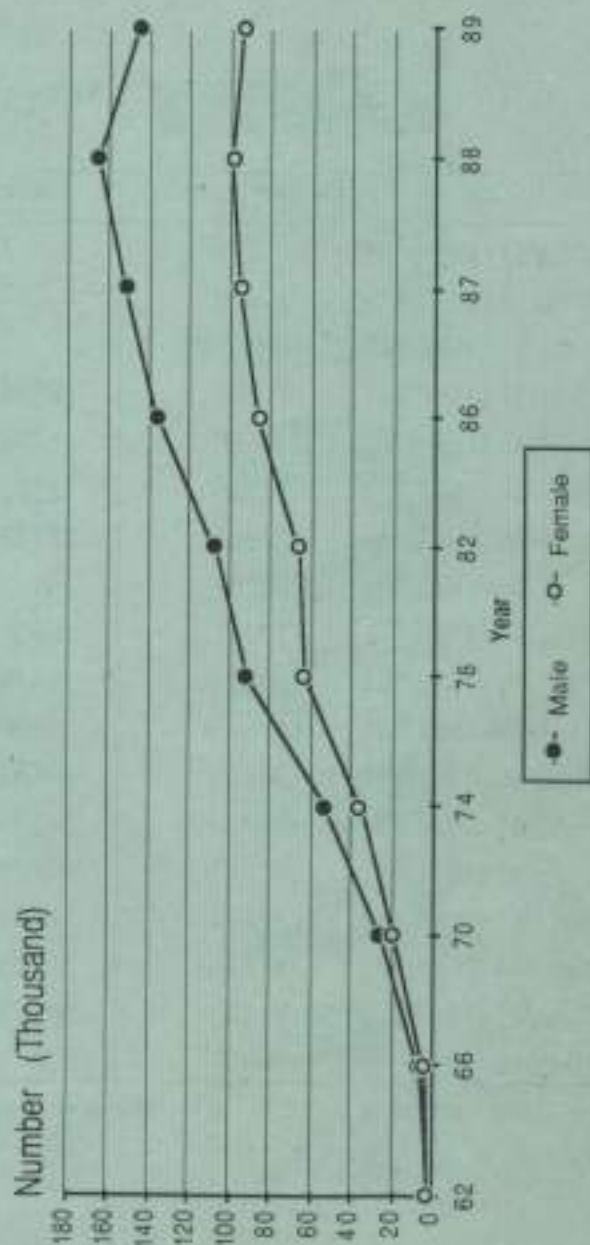

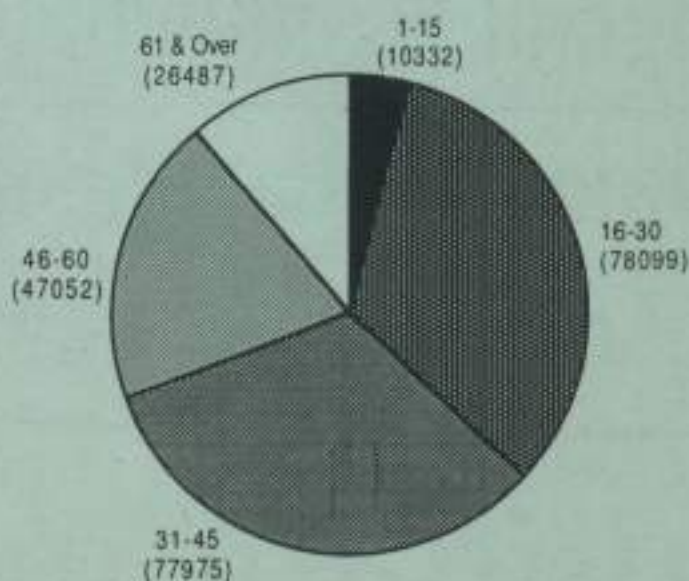

TOURIST ARRIVALS BY PURPOSE OF VISIT 1989

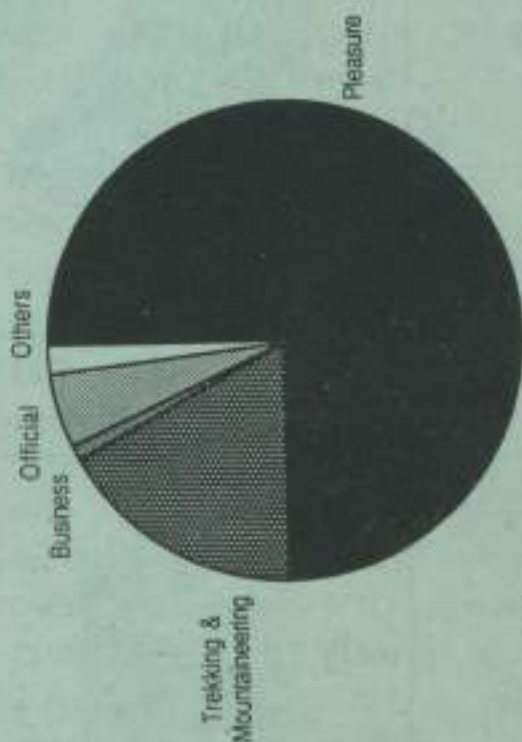

1988-1989

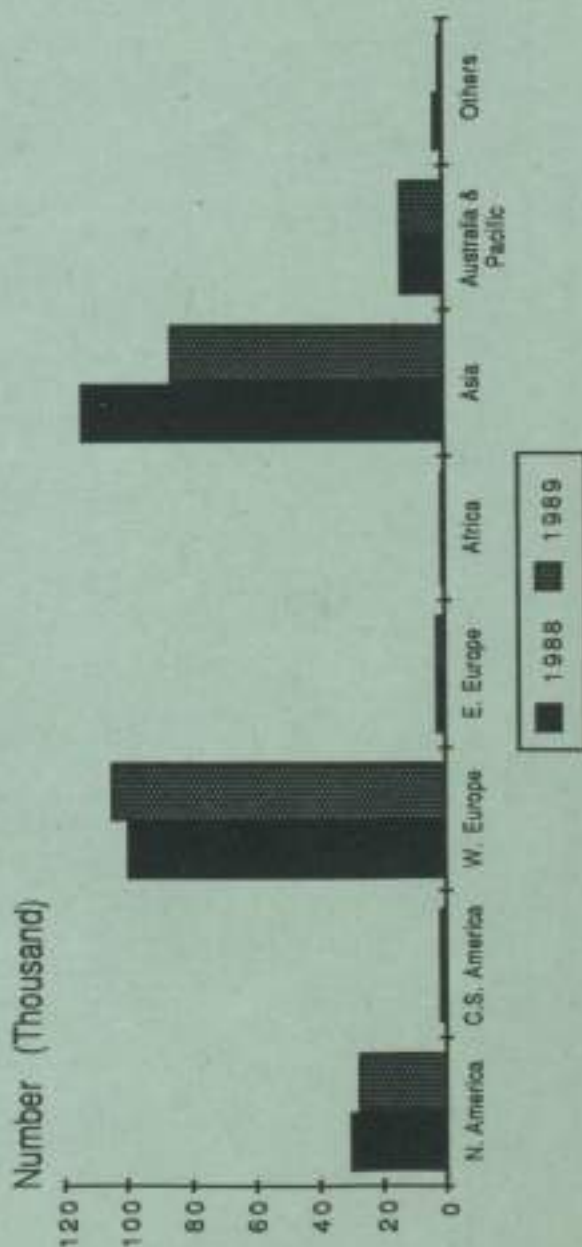

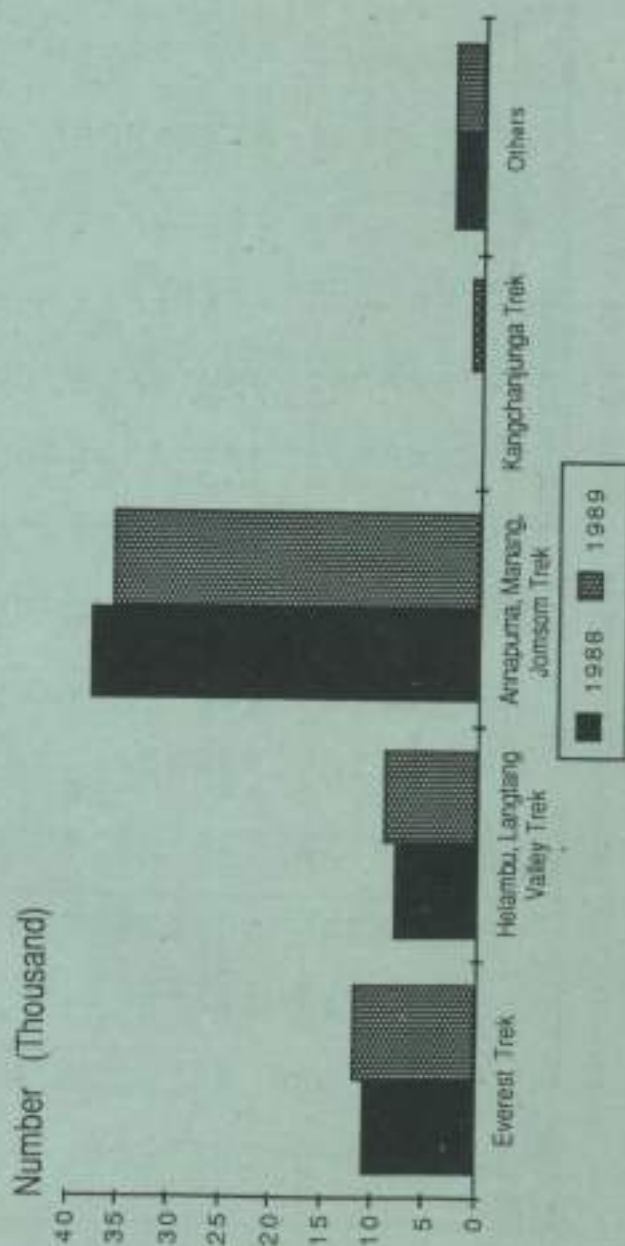

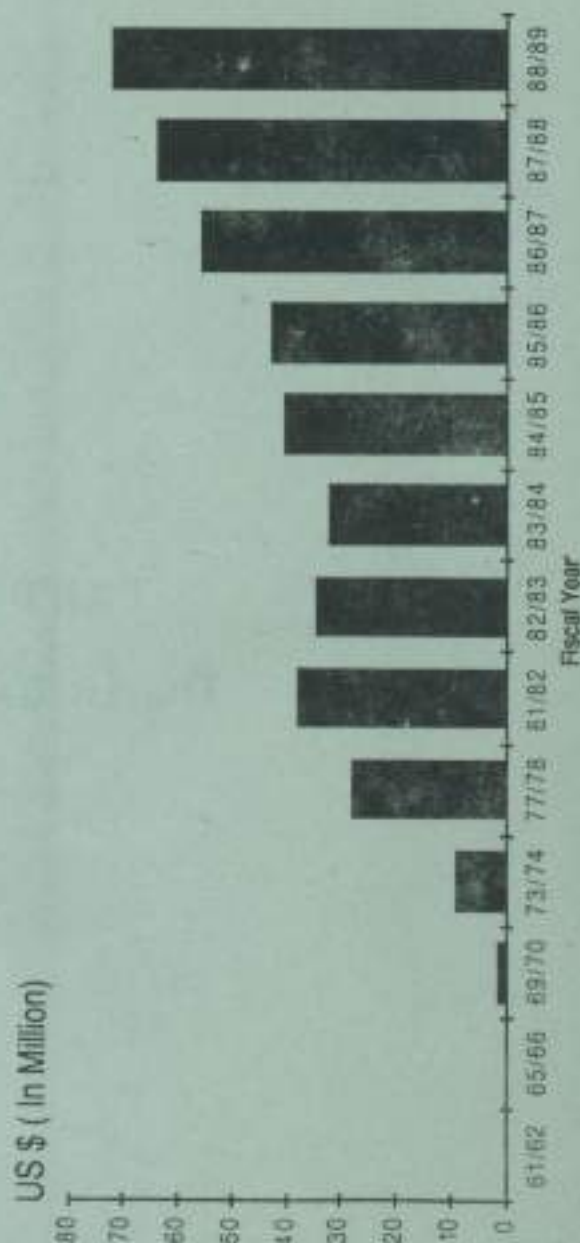

1961/62 - 1988/89

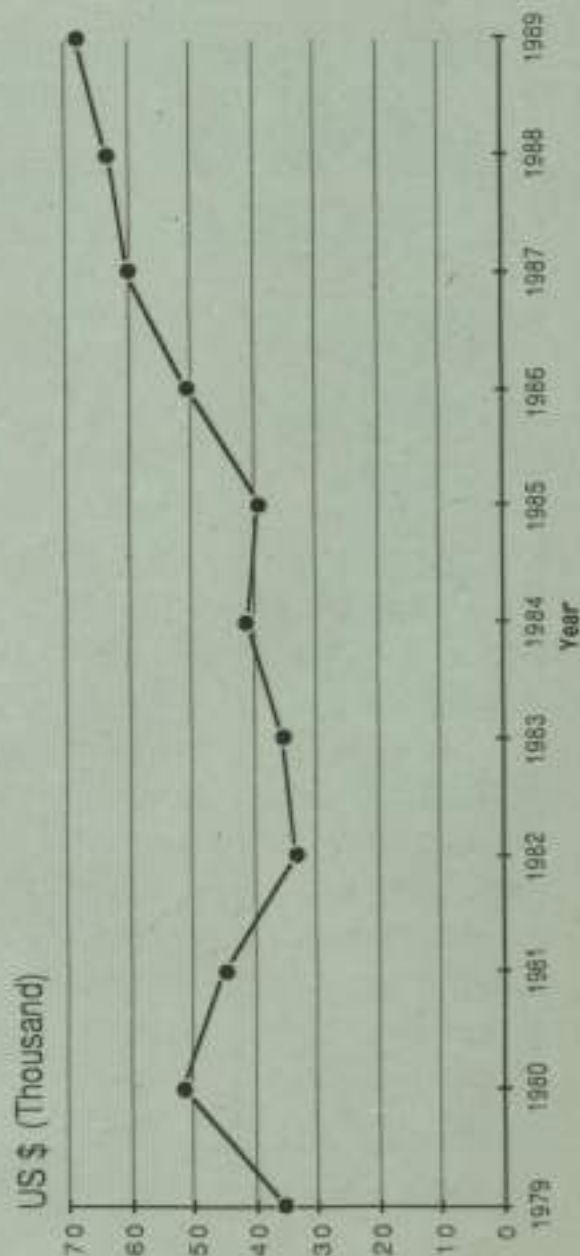

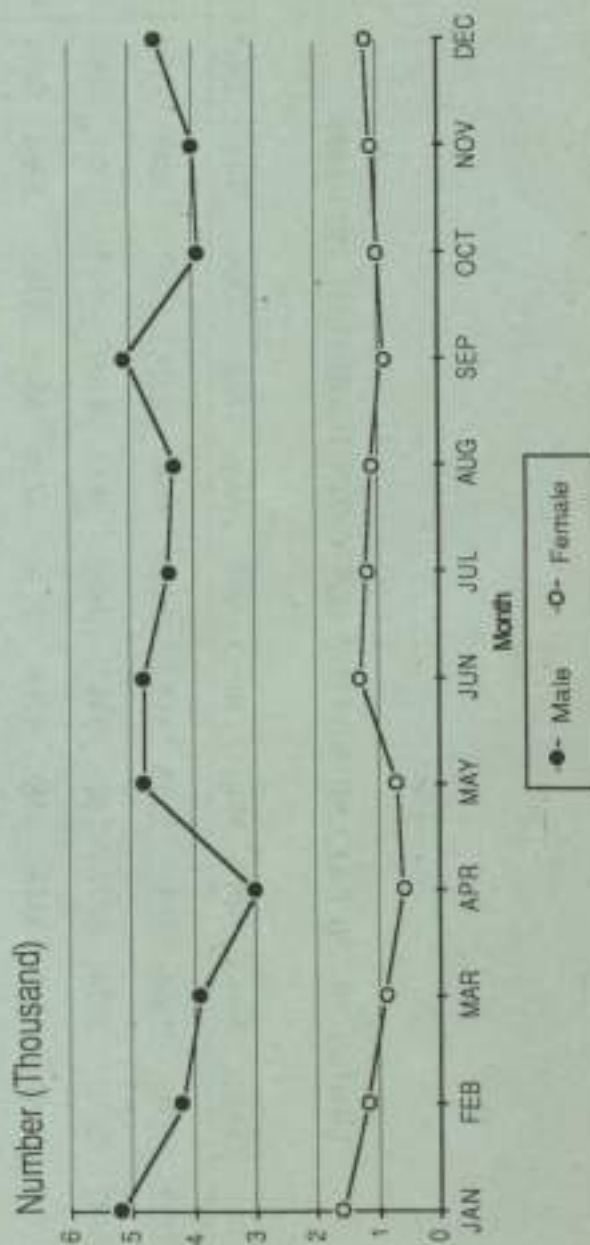
